

Keynotes

Leonard Rosenthal – The Future of PDF. Leonard Rosenthal is PDF Architect & Principal Scientist at Adobe Systems, Inc. He is responsible for the definition and standardization of PDF both within Adobe and in various international standards bodies (e.g. ISO, ETSI, OASIS). As senior member of the Acrobat engineering team he is responsible for the design and implementation of various aspects of the Adobe Acrobat and Adobe Reader product lines.

Marco Zehe – Document accessibility for software developers. Marco Zehe works at Mozilla as an accessibility QA engineer. Having joined Mozilla late 2007, he initially worked in the QA team, then transferred to the newly founded dedicated accessibility team in April of 2011. Marco Zehe has been in the AT industry since the mid-nineties when as a student he worked for the German JAWS distributor.

Tracks 1 to 3 on Tuesday

Track 1 – Archiving: PDF/A will be discussed for scanned and digital-born documents as well as new opportunities for hybrid archiving using PDF/A-3. Archiving of PDF 3D with PRC and their relationship to PDF/E will also be presented.

Track 2 – Output and Print: PDF/X and PDF/VT for prepress and printing applications are the focus standards in this track. The Altona Test Suite will be discussed in detail.

Track 3 – Inside PDF: PDF 2.0, XMP and Validation: This heavily technical track deals with validation and presents existing PDF validation options as well as future plans for extended PDF validation.

Tracks A to C on Wednesday

Track A – Accessibility: PDF/UA is the standard for creating accessible PDF files. Creation, procedures and tools as well as checking for accessibility are the main focus. Related topics for accessible and mobile PDF files are further presentations.

Track B – Signatures and SharePoint: Two sessions will discuss digital signatures in detail. SharePoint has gained a lot of momentum with new developments for PDF 2.0, and two afternoon sessions will discuss the optimal integration of PDF and PDF standards into SharePoint.

Track C – Inside PDF: PDF Creation and Processing: This is the hard core track for in-depth discussion of the PDF syntax. Creation of technically good PDF will be discussed as well as strategies for font and text handling.
